YEAR IN REVIEW

Early March found part of the club up in Madison Wisconsin for the annual “Canoecopia”. It’s the largest paddle sports expo in the Midwest. Great seminars and spending money on new gear were the highlights of that trip. Near the end of March we paddled the Kokosing River in beautiful, record setting temperatures and the water level was great. The Kokosing is a wonderful, centrally located stream, perfect for paddlers from novice to advance.

April was on Ohio Brush Creek in Adams County. A new adventure for me and paddling new streams and rivers is what it’s about. The now drought conditions in the state was rearing its ugly head. Poor Liz put some deep gouges in her carbon fiber canoe thanks to rocks and stones. It rained some later in the trip but not enough to help.

May was also on a new river for me. We put in at the spillway on Indian Lake and canoed the Great Miami River down to the Oakdale Campground. The next leg of the weekend took us to the city of Sidney. The upper Great Miami is secluded but the lower sections have major cities along it like Piqua, Troy and Dayton.

June was very hot and dry. Jock had scouted Symmes Creek in the southern portion of the state but had to change venues. Symmes Creek was way too shallow so Jock moved the trip to the Hocking River. That Friday evening was when a major storm hit the state, downing trees, power lines, etc. Paul and Harold both reported detours around blockage on state highways causing extra travel time. Paddling in 95-100 temperatures can really question a person’s sanity.

July’s outing was on the Tuscarawas River where again water levels dictated the trip. We only made 6.5 miles of paddling for the weekend but we then spent time in Zoar Village learning about history. Harold treated everyone to movie night, showing paddling films on a laptop computer.

August and the Mad River always goes together. The spring fed Mad has water even in the worst of years and it did not fail us. We welcomed new members Steve and his daughter Erica on that trip.

September was also a new adventure for me. Wil planned a trip on the upper Little Miami River. We camped at John Bryan State Park and shuttled to a put in just west of Xenia. The river was low but solo paddlers faired OK. Not the tandem folks. Lots of walking in spots. The Little Miami is pretty secluded for being in such a heavy populated area of the state.

October was Ted’s annual Little Miami trip. The section we usually paddle in the fall. We couldn’t ask for better October weather and the river had a couple inches of extra water for us. I can now say I have paddled from Xenia all the way to Morrow, Ohio.

The annual planning meeting in November saw 15 members present. We had a two and a half hour meeting. The longest since I have been a member. But we did accomplish a lot, especially on the 30th reunion gathering we are having this year.

One of Wil’s favorite sayings is “It’s great to be us” and I couldn’t agree more. Good friends, paddling and eating makes for a wonderful weekend and for those of you who we haven’t seen in a while, just remember: “A bad day canoeing beats a good day at work!!” Hope to see everyone this year when we again paddle:

OHCRA 2012 PLANNING MEETING NOTES

OHCRA Members Present:

Treasury Report:

Tom read and provided copies of the Treasury Report. OHCRA's balance as of 10/30/12 in the checking account is \$1937.33. After income and expenses we had a deficit of \$74.10 for the year. The CD value is \$5500.

Old Business:

Ted read the minutes from the 2011 Planning meeting. Following is the status of issues remaining from that meeting:

- There was some discussion related to the revised brochures. Tony will look into making them available to print from the website.
- Harold provided an update on Paul Wood. Some members talked with Paul on the phone after the meeting. Paul says he is doing okay.
- OHCRA 30 year reunion outing (Wil). This is discussed in detail below.
- Membership was discussed. We went through the list and eliminated a few names.
- Wil presented the extensive progress he has made on the event to celebrate the 30th anniversary of the first Across Ohio Adventure. The following are a few key points discussed with results:
 - The dates were previously set for July 19 thru 21, 2013.
 - Location is Indian Lake, OH.
 - Wil has an option to stay in 2 cottages with a carriage house overflow that can accommodate about 25 people.
 - Cost will be \$20/person or \$30/couple. This includes a full hot breakfast cooked by the cottage owners. It was agreed to accept this option.
 - An option for camping at the campground was discussed, and accepted, to provide for canoe equipment for those wanting to canoe or camp vs. the cottages.
 - Meat options were discussed. It was decided that Tony will obtain pulled pork for the main dish. Side dishes were selected which Wil will obtain.
 - It was agreed that OHCRA would pay for the food, invitations and leather canoes, and individuals would pay for their lodging (cottage, camping or other), and shirts.
 - It was agreed that the invitations (Jamie/Wil) would go out soon with an RSVP date of 3/15/12. A form (Wil) for ordering T-shirts and Hoodies and choice of camping or cottage, etc., will be attached to the invitation. Payment to OHCRA required to be returned with invitation.
 - Activities:
 - Friday – arrival and get together for hello's, reminiscing, etc. All should bring photo albums, slides, videos, etc., for sharing.

- Saturday – breakfast at 0800, shuttle at 1000 for those interested in boating, more camaraderie and reunion. Saturday evening – dinner and more hellos’, reminiscing, etc. All should bring photo albums, slides, videos, etc., for sharing.
- Sunday – breakfast at 0800, nothing else planned.
- All will receive a small leather canoe as a memento from the reunion.

New Business:

- Jock made a motion that OHCRA give a copy of the “Basic Canoeing Handbook” to Erika (Steve’s daughter), in appreciation of her effort and to foster her interest in canoeing. All agreed and a copy was signed by those present and given to Steve.
- The 2013 trip schedule was discussed. The resulting schedule is attached.
