problem promptly. After weeks of collect calls to Mad River, Paul was able to convince them that it was his boat. It was good to see Paul back on the river.



#### LITTLE MIAMI RIVER OUTING

#### **AUGUST 24/25**

CAMP:

- At Morgan's Riverside Campground (Gilmour Rd., Off St Rt. 123), Fri & Sat night. (1-800-932-2663) [Item 'C' on map].
- Take exit 32 off I-71. From north, turn left (east). From south, turn right (east). Follow St Rt 123, about 2 miles, watch for Morgan's sign. Turn left onto Gilmour Rd. Campsite on left at bottom of hill, along river. Watch for OHCRA signs.

COST:

- Expected to be ~\$7.00/person/night (nice campground on river with clean showers/restrooms, snack bar, shelter available, etc.).
- Canoe rental available, arrange with Morgan's Canoe Rental. They should provide shuttle to match our trip, or we will shuttle.


SAT:

- 0900, begin shuttle for a planned 10 mile trip, from Caesar Creek Canoe Access (#5 on map) to campsite. Since some have expressed desire to do longer trips, I will shuttle anyone to Spring Valley Wildlife Area Canoe Access (#6 on map). That would be a 19 mile trip. The planned group trip is as indicated above.
- We will have our pot-luck, group meal around 6 pm. Everyone should bring a dish to share. I plan to deep fry something?????.
- We plan to discuss anything necessary about the AOCA 2003, during the weekend.

SUN

- 0900, begin necessary shuttles for various length canoe trips as desired. Pick a put-in and take-out from map. See chart on map (and above chart) for different mileage.
- Bring your bike and do any portion of Little Miami Trail you desire. 40(+) miles available, from the campsite.
- Hike/bike from campsite to Fort Ancient, or a shuttle can be arranged.
